The WA Day Festival at Elizabeth Quay is back, and bigger than ever in 2018. Western Australians will be able to celebrate life in WA and everything they enjoy about our great state with the FREE Festival at Elizabeth Quay and FREE events in many regional communities.

On Sunday 3 June from 10am to 10pm and Monday 4 June from 10am to 9pm, Elizabeth Quay will burst into life with a huge variety of events, activities and performances set to wow the many thousands of people expected to pass through the precinct.

The celebrations will feature a spectacular fireworks display over the Swan River on Sunday evening, one of the largest gatherings of Food Trucks ever in WA at Eat Street, a bigger than ever Play In WA kids zone, brand new BAR.BITES.BEATS from Bar Pop with DJs and multiple bars serving local beers and wines, all topped off with awesome live and local performers.

Gina and Guy will come together with the One Big Voice singers, a group made up of students between the ages of 10 and 15, to perform Wanjoo, the welcome song Gina wrote in Noongar that has been taught to children all over the state.

The big stage crowd will also be lucky enough to hear from international performer Grace Barbe and her band. Hailing from the Seychelles, Grace and her band fuse traditional beats and rhythms with pop, reggae and psychedelic rock to create a truly unique sound. The audience will also be up on their feet for workshops from the highly popular Bollywood Dance Studio, testing their brains with a quiz from crowd favourite Famous Sharon, and amazed by the mind-boggling magic show of illusionist Pierre Ullric.

Under the Big Top kids and the young at heart can step up to play against the Perth Wildcats, or test their cricket skills and meet the Perth Scorchers. Girls Make Your Move will inspire, energise and empower young women to be more active, bringing free yoga and dance workshops along with heaps of great giveaways!

Tastebuds will be tantalised by Perth's biggest and best international food truck line-up, representing the state's melting pot of culture. Toast My Curry, Locale Kitchen, Jumplings, Mantu Hut, Standing Fork and The Wooden Box Cart are just a few of the popular portable eateries to be found at Eat Street, serving everything from Canadian Poutine, Perth's best Laksa, Japanese pan fried dumplings, Afghan cuisine and curry toasties (yes, curry toasties!). Guests can sit back, relax and watch the Centre Stage action on the big screen or drop in to the Channel 7 Perth Live Studio, where everyone can have a go at reading the News, have their photo taken at Summer Bay and take part in a handball competition to win themselves a prize.

On Monday, 4 June the area transforms in to the awesome SOTA Festival, a FREE all-ages festival of internationally renowned local talent.
