BUNBURY'S WA DAY FESTIVAL CELEBRATES THE BEST OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA

The highly popular FREE WA Day Festival in Bunbury is back for 2019, showcasing the very best of WA culture and everything that makes our State great at a brand new location – Bicentennial Park.

On Sunday June 2 from 10am to 3pm Bicentennial Park – hosted by the Stirling Street Arts Centre – will be jam packed with free activities for the whole family, including a bouncy castle, face painting, henna tattoos and Bollywood dancers.

Performances from Top of the Stairs Puppets will delight adults and children alike as colourful string puppets roam around the market stalls before performing on the Main Stage. The best of Bunbury's music talent will be highlighted in performances by the Anchormen Choir and local bands.

For punters who have worked up an appetite, a variety of food vans showcasing local and international cuisines will keep them well fed over the day.

Celebrate WA Chairman Michael Anghie said WA Day was a time for Western Australians to come together and celebrate all the fantastic things about the State.

"As Western Australians we have so much to be proud of. Across the world we're celebrated for our can-do attitude, our entrepreneurship, our good humour, hard work and our sense of community - all things that Western Australian's are proud to live by.
